2012 will be remembered as a year of anniversaries and achievements. What better moment to get in tune with the national mood and to pay tribute to the 30^{th} Anniversary of the U3A by showcasing the achievements of the Knutsford and District Branch? The Committee decided to go with the idea. The date was fixed for 13 September, the venue the Civic Hall, the time 2 pm -4 pm.

All of our 40 groups were involved and co-ordinators were asked to make a display showing some aspect of their activities. As usual, our co-ordinators responded magnificently to the challenge and not only provided displays but were also ready with explanations and information for the enquiring visitors. The huge variety of interest groups and the high standards of excellence shown drew much favourable comment.

In addition to the static displays, the Tatton Room next door hosted two live presentations with accompanying slide shows. The audience was also treated to an excerpt from an Oscar Wilde play performed by the Play Reading Group.

A seemingly endless amount of teas and coffees were served throughout the afternoon by our very able catering team. Those who took advantage to have a break from walking around and looking at the displays were very appreciative of both the refreshments and the seating area provided.

The number of visitors exceeded expectations and it is estimated that over 200 people were in the Hall at any one time. From the moment that the doors opened, a steady stream of people arrived and the Hall was soon thronged with visitors, members and their guests. Judging by the noise level, there was a great deal of interest from the start which continued until time was called at 4 pm.

Given the public's positive response, we are agreed that the Showcase was a huge success and it has raised the profile of U3A within the local community – as well as bringing in new members.

It is almost invidious to single out individuals in this enterprise since everyone who participated gave 100% commitment to making it happen. However, the major credit must go to the sub-committee who masterminded the whole process and Rod Howgate, Sue Hopkin and Carole English in particular who did the detailed planning and implementation. Thank you to all involved.

REVIEW OF THE VISIT TO STRATFORD

On 9th September we were all in the coach ahead of time, looking forward to a visit to Stratford with a tour of the Royal Shakespeare Company Theatre and a matinee performance included.

The tour started as soon as we arrived at the theatre. It gave us a fascinating insight into the workings of the different areas of this famous building. The building has undergone a huge transformation recently. We saw the result of this in the auditorium, where there is a new thrust stage that juts out into the audience with seating almost all the way around it. This gives an intimate feel for both actors and audience. We learned theatre history and tricks of the trade – a theatre entrance from under water, which we later saw, must be one of the trickiest. We saw backstage areas, costumes, and the amazing electronics packed control room that overlooks the auditorium. After visiting the interesting Swan Theatre the tour ended at the top of the theatre Tower with wide views over Stratford. The whole tour had been full of interest.

We now had time for lunch. It was delightful to sit in the sun overlooking the river, soaking up the views and the atmosphere.

The performance followed and we saw the comedy Twelfth Night. This production has a modern-day setting with imaginative and ingenious set design. The comedy of the play was well to the fore, with the slapstick element certainly being quite unexpected There were some strong performances from the cast and it all ended to much applause.

The whole day was hugely enjoyable, with our new background information adding another dimension to the stage performance. Thank you Margaretfor all your work in organising the whole day.

REVIEW OF THE VISIT TO CLONTER OPERA

On 19 July last, 13 members of the Music Appreciation Group went to Clonter Opera Theatre, a quirky barn with a 400 seat auditorium and bar and dining areas. Before the performance of Hansel and Gretel (sung in English) we had an informative talk about the production and the interpretation of the work. I found this really helped my understanding of each of the Acts.

We enjoyed the performances of seven very talented young performers, whose fabulous voices and considerable acting skills brought the Fairy Tale to life. The music of the original Englebert Humperdinck was performed by an orchestra of 15 excellent young musicians. The lady percussionist so talented that she was often playing two or three instruments at the same time.

The sets and costumes were very imaginative with a great contrast between the stark conditions of their desperately poor home, the forest, and the modern highly colourful temptations on offer from The Witch, who were no pointy hat, or warty nose, but was dressed to kill in a modern bright red outfit – a compelling interpretation and a talented performance.

Clonter Opera Trust is committed to nurturing new talent and providing the highest quality training and performance opportunities for singers who, after many years of study, are at the beginning of their careers. There are many examples of artists who have appeared at Clonter going on to be Prize Winners and greater success. The performance which we watched was certainly of a high standard and we had a most enjoyable evening. Many thanks to our Co-ordinator, Susan Hopkin who organised everything for us.
