## VISIT TO BLETCHLEY PARK - With Overnight Stay

It was in September 1938 that Captain Ridley and his "shooting party" first strode into Bletchley Park a country estate some 50 miles north-west of London, and reversed the tide of history. For these new arrivals were in reality a select band of mathematicians and code breakers destined to crack the Nazi Enigma, the backbone of German military communications. The odds of winning the jackpot in the national lottery are approximately one in 14 million; the odds against cracking Enigma are 158 million, million, million to one.

The Outings Committee of Knutsford U3A and McCarthys Coaches are arranging a visit to Bletchley Park from 8<sup>th</sup> to 9<sup>th</sup> June 2014, exclusively for Knutsford U3A members. The itinerary will be:

## Sunday 8<sup>th</sup> June 2014

Leave Knutsford by coach and visit Waddesdon Manor a renaissance style chateau built by Baron Ferdinand de Rothschild to display his collection of art treasures. The Victorian garden is considered one of the finest in Britain. This is a National Trust property near Aylesbury.

Leave Waddesdon for our hotel, the Hilton at Milton Keynes, for an overnight stay. This is a modern hotel with an indoor swimming pool. All bedrooms have en-suite facilities. Evening dinner at the hotel is included in the price.

## Monday 9<sup>th</sup> June 2014

After breakfast at our hotel we leave for Bletchley Park where we will have a guided tour of the key locations and buildings at Bletchley. We will have lunch at Bletchley and leave for our return journey during the afternoon.

The cost of this visit is £115 per person sharing a double/twin room. The single room supplement is £22. This includes the following;

- Luxury coach travel throughout
- Entrance to Bletchley Park with guided tour
- Light lunch at Bletchley and coffee/tea and biscuits
- 1 night's dinner bed and breakfast at the Hilton Hotel Milton Keynes

## **Additional costs:**

- £13 per person entrance fee to Waddesdon Manor, if you are not a member of the National Trust. Waddesdon requires all groups to pay in advance.
- £13.50 optional insurance.

£40 deposit per person is required with each booking

## WRITING FOR PLEASURE

During the month we write a piece, usually a short story (up to 2000 words), based on an agreed idea. At the following meeting we each read out our piece to the others. The atmosphere is friendly – in fact there is much laughter at most meetings. Topics are varied, examples include: a picture; an opening sentence; a key word or phrase e.g. 'overheard' or 'revenge is a dish best served cold'; a list of words which have to be incorporated in the piece; or a type – melodrama, mystery etc. etc.

Writing for Pleasure may be more challenging than some groups, in that members write a piece between each meeting. This is not easy – but it's surprising how, when staring at a blank sheet of paper or computer screen inspiration comes to one's fingertips!

For those who were good at English at school, for those who would like to compensate for the bad teaching they received, for those who could write superb factual reports – 'but I haven't a creative bone in my body' – in fact for anyone – why not have a go? It's interesting how often new members move from autobiographically based pieces to true fiction as their confidence and experience expands. In time hidden talents blossom, generating imaginative and entertaining stories – a satisfying experience for both the writer and the listeners.

We are always glad to welcome newcomers who would like to try their hand at writing short pieces in a friendly, encouraging atmosphere – so let's hear from you! ## REVIEWS OF OUTINGS

## LOCAL HISTORY GROUP

On a dry and sunny October day 24 members of the Local History Group left Knutsford by coach to visit Whitmore Hall in Staffordshire. The Hall is a Grade 1 listed building designated as a house of outstanding architectural and historical interest and is a fine example of a small Carolinian Manor House. This is the home to the Cavenagh – Mainwaring family whose family had connections to the Mainwarings of Peover Hall. The property and land has passed through to both male and female issue. Whitmore Hall has been in continuous ownership of the family since 1066. In 1547 an inheriting daughter married Edward Mainwaring.

The current owners, Guy, 34th Hereditary Lord of Whitmore, and his wife Christine, met the group in the lobby and Christine gave us a very interesting, entertaining talk and tour of this lovely house. After inheriting it in a rather sad and neglected state Guy and Christine proceeded to explore the possibility of finding an earlier house on the site of the property before they redecorated it. After making large holes in the walls they found the evidence of the earlier house. We were shown good examples of the original timbers from the earlier Tudor house which had been encased and modified with a brick surround in 1676. I am pleased to say that the exploratory holes have been expertly concealed behind folding doors and the rooms are now beautifully redressed and decorated. Christine gave a talk on her husband's family history which was supported by portrait paintings dating back to 1624 to the present generation. Christine's book 'From 1066 to Waltzing Matilda' was on sale. It gives a light-hearted journey through 900 years of family life and their connections with Australia, family skeletons and ghosts!

We had refreshments in the dining room before Guy took us to see an example of Carolinian stables. To see the upper floor you had to climb the steep stairs holding onto a rope. - I wasn't brave enough but many were! We had free time to explore the garden before leaving for lunch at Bridgemere Garden Centre, and an opportunity for shopping before returning to Knutsford.

#### VISIT TO CHETHAMS
