PLAS NEWYDD

Tuesday, 1st July 2014

We have arranged a full day's excursion to Plas Newydd, the ancestral home of the Marquess of Anglesey, renowned for its wonderful setting on the Menai Strait, with spectacular views of Snowdon. The elegant 18th century house is famous for its association with Rex Whistler whose largest painting is here. A military museum features the Battle of Waterloo and the Charge of the Light Brigade. The extensive gardens provide walks and, of course, stunning views.

The coach will leave Knutsford Bus Station at 9 am and we expect to return about 6 pm.

The cost of this visit is £25.00, which includes: - Morning coffee en route; Buffet lunch in our own dining room; entrance to the house and gardens. **N.B.** There is an additional charge of £7.50 each for those who are not members of the National Trust (or who forget to bring their N.T. card!). This is payable on the coach in the morning.

VICTORIA BATHS and the MORAVIAN COMMUNITY MANCHESTER

Thursday 18th September

Victoria Baths is widely recognised as Britain's finest historic municipal swimming pool. In 2003 it was voted as the building BBC2 viewers most wanted to see restored. As a result the front block of the building is now restored and visitors can view its decorative features of stained glass windows, mosaic floors, glass block paving and the Turkish Baths suite as well as the three pool halls. You are advised to have a warm jumper or fleece with you for this visit.

The Moravian Settlement at Fairfield Square in Droylsden opened in 1785. Planned and built by Moravians it functioned as a self-contained village. The Moravian Church started in the late 14th century when members wanted to return to the simpler practices of early Christianity. The cobbled streets and Georgian houses are carefully preserved and as you turn into Fairfield Square you have the feeling of going back in time.

The cost of the visits is £20 per person and this includes coach fare, coffee/tea and biscuits on arrival at Victoria Baths, guided tour of the building and lunch of soup and sandwiches and, at the Moravian Settlement, a guided tour followed by tea and biscuits.

The coach will leave Knutsford Bus Station at 9.30 am and leave Droylsden for Knutsford at 3.30 pm.

The BBC Philharmonic, with their chief conductor, Juanjo Mena, start the evening with Beethoven's brilliant and energetic Fourth Symphony. They are then joined by four soloists and the CBSO chorus for his Ninth 'Choral' Symphony, with its final, uplifting, 'Ode to Joy'. Wonderful!

HOW TO USE OUR WEBSITE

The Website can be reached by searching for "Knutsford U3A" on Google or similar search engine such as Bing or Yahoo, or by going direct to the address http://knutsfordu3a.co.uk. (To access website addresses in this article, highlight the address, hold the control (Ctrl) key down, and click on the address).

You will arrive at the Homepage, but to find your way round from any page you can either use the menus on the left to go step by step to the page you need, or use the Sitemap on the right of the blue bar below the contact box which gives a list of all the pages on the website. You can return to the Homepage or go direct to "Activity Groups" from the same blue bar. The examples below show how to locate specific pages.

<u>How to Find Information on the Following Topics.</u> Go to the Homepage (see above), then follow the steps below:
