Choral Symphony at the Bridgewater Hall

MAHLER'S CHORAL SYMPHONY NO. 8 With Chethams Symphony Orchestra

Mahler's Choral symphony has become known as the 'Symphony of a Thousand Voices'. I doubt if there will be quite that many in this performance, but I can promise you at least six choirs! The Chethams Chorus; Leeds Festival Chorus; Manchester Cathedral Choristers; St George's Singers; Greater Manchester Youth Choir and Hereford Cathedral Children's Choir. It should make for a glorious sound! Considered one of the greatest symphonic masterpieces of the repertoire, it is Mahler's colossal vision of 'the

whole universe ringing and resounding' – a truly mighty work.

This concert is the centrepiece of Chetham's School of Music 50th anniversary year celebrations, so I am sure the

whole hall will resound with youthful enthusiasm and talent. Another unique occasion.

New play at The Royal Exchange Theatre

THERE IS A LIGHT WHICH NEVER GOES OUT - Scenes from the Luddite Rebellion by James Yeatman

This is a new play, so I can't exactly recommend it, but I thought it looked interesting and hope some of you will feel like taking a chance with it! I have booked preview seats, so that they are almost half the price of ordinary performances.

The play reminds us of the Luddites of the Industrial Revolution, who smashed the new machines that were transforming their livelihood, complaining that technology was beating down the workers, and brings the same complaints into the present day. 'Using 21st century artefacts and technology, this is a vivid and passionate production, Showing how the Luddite protests remain massively relevant today' (from Exchange notes).

BLACK COUNTRY LIVING MUSEUM DUDLEY, WEST MIDLANDS

This multi award winning museum is a 26 acre open air museum with something for everyone and catering for all ages. Join in 300 years of history and experience the sights, sounds, smells and tastes of the Black Country's past. There is a tram or trolley bus service every 15 minutes across the site. Maps and information are available on arrival. Highlights include:-

Costumed characters who will explain what it was like to live and work in one of the world's most heavily industrialised landscapes.

Shops and houses Explore original period shops and houses.

Live demonstrations See sparks fly as the chain maker forges a link, witness the glow of the forges, smell the steam of the engines and hear the banging of hot metal.

Underground Mine Tour Descend on foot "into the thick" of the underground drift mine and face the harsh reality of a coal miner's life in the 1850s. (30 minutes' duration)

Option of a Dudley Canal trip - NB This is operated by Dudley Canal Trust at an extra charge of £6.50/£7.50 pp depending on numbers. Travel into the spectacular Limestone Caverns. (1 hour's duration)

A Victorian school lesson Test your times tables in a 1912 school lesson.

Transport Collection Take a ride on one of the heritage vehicles and find out about the importance of the Black Country in their manufacture. Travel on the longest trolleybus route in the UK.

Animals Meet the pigs, horses and Sussex Buff hens.

Pub Quench your thirst in the Bottle and Glass Inn where a warm welcome awaits in this traditional spit and sawdust pub.

Report on visit to Chetham's Library and Manchester Cathedral

On 11 March a group from Knutsford U3A felt more like time-travellers moving from the modern skyscrapers of the city to step into Medieval Manchester. First stop was Chethams Library for a guided



tour with Jonathan Schofield; the building of 1421 original accommodated priests from the nearby collegiate church - later to become the cathedral. A bequest Humphrey Chetham by successful Manchester textile merchant) enabled the building to be purchased in 1653 to create a school and Library - now the oldest free public lending library in the UK. Its 100,000 volumes (over half of which were published before 1851) were not even catalogued until 1791 and then only in Latin! It has now been acknowledged by The

Arts Council to be a collection of great, national importance. The building is a treasure trove of stone passages, oak staircases and richly panelled rooms containing manuscripts, books and paintings. It's hard to think that Karl Marx and Friedrich Engels met there – perhaps even to research ideas for their Communist Manifesto?

Then it was on to a tour with three guides of Manchester Cathedral. Formerly the Collegiate Church of St Mary, St Denys and St George this historic, parish church became a cathedral when a new Manchester diocese was created in 1847; it was substantially renovated in 1887 with most of the stonework being Victorian. Lovingly restored after damage in the Blitz of 1940 and IRA bombing in 1996, the cathedral now has one of the finest collections of new stained glass in the country with the Alan Davis's 2016 'Hope' window and artist Anthony Hollaway's 'Wall of Light', a stunning installation created by the five windows along the west wall. The interior woodwork is original 15th and 16th century; high up in the nave are angels carrying replica mediaeval instruments highlighted in gold. The medieval misericords in the Quire are said to be some of the finest in Europe dating from 1495-1506.

Our thanks to Margaret Hinde for organizing such an interesting and enjoyable day.

Reduction in annual subscription

The Committee continually monitors our finances carefully. Over the last few years our expenditure has been less than our annual income as our membership has grown. In order to comply with the Charity Commission's regulations it is necessary to reduce the amount of money that we, as a U3A, hold in reserve (figures will be available at the AGM). To this end the Committee have decided to reduce the annual subscription to £13 per head per annum from Sept 2019. The level of the annual membership subscription will be kept under review and it is likely to rise again in future once our reserves reduce to the appropriate level. The Committee have also decided, in the absence of volunteers to run the service, to subsidise the provision of refreshments at the monthly Members' Meetings.

Promotional Video

The Great Get Together

Some scenes in the promotional video were recorded at last year's Great Get Together in St John's Church. Held during the weekend when the Nation organises many events bringing people together in the spirit of Jo Cox, the MP killed in June 2016. She famously said in her inaugural parliamentary speech "We are far more united and have far more in common than that which divides us".

Old School is organising another Great Get Together this year, which will be held from **2-4pm on Sunday 23rd June in St John's Church, Knutsford**. The event is free, no tickets are required and is open to anyone who is a retired resident of Knutsford or a member of the Knutsford & District U3A together with the students from Knutsford Academy. There will be opportunities to socialise, refreshments served to your table and, we anticipate, some musical entertainment from the students. So, hold the date for a great get together!

Further Development of the Project

To date the Project has involved children between 13 and 15 years old. We are in discussion with Egerton Primary School with the prospect of providing the opportunity for U3A members to meet with children under 11 years old. This would necessarily take on a slightly different arrangement to that at Knutsford Academy, but we would like to run a trial project after the Easter break to explore what will work best. When we have agreed the way forward with the teaching staff involved, we will circulate an (email) invitation to U3A members for a joint meeting to start the process.
