From the Chair

With the weather improving and the arrival of spring things are looking up after a uniquely difficult winter for all of us. With most of us having received our first jab against Covid-19 and the vaccine roll-out continuing at a good pace it is time to look forward to the easing of restrictions and the resumption of activities.

How activities might resume and the associated planning has been a big part of the Committee's activity over the last couple of months and this will continue into the summer. At least two walking groups and several other outdoor groups are planning to restart in the second half of April. In this Kanuta you will find details of the first organised u3a trip in early July to RHS Bridgewater garden. We hope to be able to offer a full program of activities by Autumn.

Also in this Kanuta you will find details of how to renew your membership. For the 2021/2022 membership year (starting 1st of April) we have reduced the membership fee to £10 for full members and £5 for associate members. We have been able (through the great efforts of Adrian Long, our Treasurer supported by the Beacon subcommittee) to provide three different ways for you to renew and we strongly encourage you to renew online if possible.

The Committee this month says goodbye to two longstanding members who have decided to step down. Christine Jones, our previous Chair, served that role for over 4 years, and (as described in a previous Kanuta) has provided great support to myself and the Committee over the last very difficult year. The other member who is standing down after our April Committee meeting is Veronica Gordon who has been on the Committee for over 10 years, and was membership secretary for 9 years. The Committee thanks both Christine and Veronica for all their hard work in support of our u3a and sends their best wishes for the future.

Membership Renewal

You will remember that your subscription that you paid in Sept 2019 was extended until the end of March this year, a six month extension, due to the fact that our activities have been curtailed due to Covid. Well the end of March is almost upon us so I have to inform you that your renewal subscriptions will be due from the 1st April. The renewal subscription is £10 for the next year. This is a reduction on last year and this amount will probably only apply for this year as we are still operating at limited capacity due to Covid.

Now that we have moved our membership and finance operations to the Beacon on-line system you have 3 options (all available from the **Membership section** of the Knutsford u3a website) regarding how to pay your renewal subscription:

Payment by PayPal/debit card/credit card

Using this system avoids you having to print off and post a renewal form. You can go to our website www.knutsfordu3a.co.uk where you will find a link to the Beacon renewal system. You will have previously been sent an email containing your details as they are currently held on Beacon and also giving your membership number. Once you have clicked on the link on the website you will be sent to the Members Portal. Here you will need to log in to the Beacon system using these details even if they are incorrect (eg wrong digit in postcode, name incorrectly spelt). Once you have accessed the Members Portal you can then renew your membership by payment either via Paypal or via a credit/debit card. In the Member' Portal there is also an option to update your details where you can correct any errors in the details held. You can also use this option at any time if you change your email address. Your membership card will be emailed to you as soon as you have paid your £10 renewal. The same system is available to Associate Members who need to follow the same link on the website. The Associate Member renewal fee is £5 for the year. There is a brief User Guide to this system on our website if you wish to consult this before you renew.

Setting up a Direct Debit via GoCardless

A second option you may wish to use is to set up a direct debit using the link to GoCardless which is also on the Knutsford u3a website. This would mean that your membership will be paid automatically each year on 1st April. Once you have set this up you will receive a confirmation email and a copy of your direct debit mandate. You would be informed prior to any increase in fee which would be debited automatically unless you cancelled the direct debit. Your membership card will then be either emailed to you or sent by post. If you do use this option I would be grateful if you would inform me by emailing me at membership@knutsfordu3a.co.uk.

Postal renewal

The third renewal payment option is to fill in the paper form given in this edition of Kanuta which is also available for download from our website. As stated on the form, you should send your form, cheque and stamped addressed envelope to the Membership Secretary, Sue Allan, at 8 Bracken Way, Knutsford, WA16 9BU. (Please note: we cannot accept cash). Your membership card will be sent back to you in your sae.

Claire Hart, a clinical scientist, from Sheffield Children's Hospital will give a talk entitled 'Behind the Scenes in a hospital laboratory'. If you've ever wondered what happens to the blood samples that your GP takes — where do they go and what happens to them, how are the results obtained, who does the work? this is your chance to find out about the world of NHS laboratory services and the unsung but crucial role they play in patient diagnosis and treatment.

Going to A&E during lockdown

I thought it would be useful to members to share my experience of attending A&E during lockdown.

Even if you are fit and well now, I would recommend having a small bag packed with essential items which you can grab easily and take with you to A&E in case you fall ill and are admitted into hospital. You may live on your own or your partner may be isolating or asleep in bed when you are admitted and unable to bring your essentials to the hospital. They also may not be able to find the things you need or forget the obvious!

I recommend putting in the bag: an up-to-date list of any drugs you are taking and a list of any drugs you have had an adverse reaction to, your mobile phone, a phone charger and ear plugs. A pair of PJs with short sleeves, slippers, a change of underwear and a basic washing kit would also be useful.

In future I know that I will be much better prepared. I ended up with walking socks but no PJs or shower gel!

Of us


