Making Knutsford u3a Accessible to All Third Agers

I am the Knutsford u3a Accessibility Officer and I would like to talk to you about what this means.

U3as are doing all they can to be as accessible as possible both to their existing members and to third agers in their local communities who may wish to join. We are already taking all reasonable steps to ensure that people with disabilities can attend the activity groups of their choice. There will be all sorts of reasons why someone may not find our groups and meetings accessible and we will do all we can to support them and make their attendance as easy and stress-free as possible.

Here are two ways you can help to make Knutsford u3a more accessible.

At present most of our meeting are being held by Zoom. This means that we send messages by email with the access code shortly before the meeting. If you have not given us an email address we cannot send you this information quickly so please let us know your email address. If you do not have email perhaps you can arrange for another member to let you have this information so you can participate in all our meetings. Please contact us at info@knutsfordu3a.co.uk so you can make sure that you can access our on line meetings.

Hearing loss affects 12 million people in the UK. This means that 12 million people have difficulty hearing other people clearly, and may misunderstand what they say, especially in noisy places. Having to concentrate hard to hear what other people are saying can be tiring or stressful and may deter people from joining our activity groups.

Many people rely on lip reading to understand what you are saying so please always look at the person when you are speaking.

Frequently people with hearing aids use hearing loops to pick up speech. T loops are available in public places and also with mobile phones, landlines, TV and radio but people need time to connect.

If someone answers their phone and says they cannot hear you, do not automatically hang up, wait and give them time. It is likely that they are switching over to their phone loop.

If you are leaving a message please slow down and remember that we all need time understand the message and to write down your phone number.

During this presentation you will hear from a volunteer speaker from the charity, Medical Detection Dogs speaking about the work of the charity, the welfare of the dogs, how it all came about and their aims for the future. Medical Detection Dogs are trained to detect the odour of human disease and alert us to those diseases in a variety of ways. You will learn the scientific basics of the dog's super sense and how diseases change the make-up and odour of our cells. There will also be video input from some of the clients who directly benefit from having their own Medical Alert Assistance Dog and up to date information on current work. **Thursday 8th July The 'Story of Knutsford'** – a talk by **David Bryant** covering the history of Knutsford from King Canute to the present day which will include some unique photographs. **** From September onwards we are really hoping to be able to resume our 'in person' meetings in Knutsford Methodist Church. This will obviously only be possible if Government Guidelines and KMC's rules allow so you will be kept informed. If all goes well our first meeting will be at 2.15pm in Knutsford Methodist Church.

FURTHER AFTERNOON VISIT TO THE RHS GARDEN BRIDGEWATER Monday 6th September 2021 Coach departs Knutsford Bus Station at 12 noon Cost £20 a head. (RHS Members, £12 a head)

Following the popularity of two coach trips in July to RHS Garden Bridgewater, we have arranged a further visit on Monday 6th September

The coach will depart from the Bus Station at <u>12 noon</u>, **prompt**.

The RHS Bridgewater offers lunch or light refreshments, with indoor and outdoor seating, for you to buy your own. (Mask and credit card required.) You could, of course, bring your own picnic to eat in the gardens. Picnic tables have been provided.

Currently the RHS are not offering guided tours, so you will be free to wander round the 154 acres at will. Volunteer guides will be situated around the garden.

However, in lieu of the tours, the RHS have offered us their published guide, normally priced at £6, at half price when booking. So, we have included one copy, for 2 people to share, with the ticket price. Should you require your own copy, for single use, please add £2 to your payment.

Members of the Royal Horticultural Society do not pay to enter the gardens. Please indicate on the booking form if you are a member and provide your membership number.

Finally, nearer the time, if you feel you would prefer to follow the coach in your own car, you are obviously welcome to do so – but we will not be issuing refunds for the coach fare! In this case, <u>please meet the coach In Booths car park</u> and sign in as usual, so I know you are doing this. Tickets will not be available until we arrive at the garden, so, initially, we need to keep together.
