Members' Meetings **Knutsford Methodist Church** Second Thursday of every month starting at 2.15pm Please note the new starting time for our Members' Meetings. 14th April Eddie Tarry, Community Engagement Manager at HMPPS & YOI Styal, will give a talk on Living in Styal - 'Building Hope, Changing Lives'. Styal is the only female prison in the NW. Eddie will speak about the daily life inside the prison, the regime and what activities are delivered that will benefit women whilst in custody and, more importantly, will ultimately reduce the possibility of re-offending. 12th May Peter Braun will give a illustrated talk on Dunham Massey entitled 'The Monarchy and Dunham, the Grey area', covering the history of Dunham Hall, the families, royal claims, intrigue, executions, power, passion and scandal. Peter is a National Trust speaker and tour guide at Dunham Massey Hall. 9th June George Lane, Manchester Airport Chaplain, will give a talk on 'The Life and Times of an Airport Chaplain'. 14th July AGM – followed by speaker Lisa Collas, Cheshire East Council, who will give a talk about recycling.

Proposed Knutsford u3a Quarterly Meeting

At the February u3a Committee meeting we discussed the possibility of expanding our educational and social activities by introducing a locally-generated quarterly meeting in addition to our current monthly Members' meeting.

We thought that it might comprise a half hour presentation by one of our activity groups followed by a second half hour lecture by a volunteer member. The Activity group half hour could be either a joint presentation by members of the group or one presented by an individual (we do recognise that not every group would be able to contribute).

For the second half hour we have over seven hundred members in our U3A, a good number of them will have had interesting experiences in their lives or will have worked in occupations that would entertain and/or educate others. If we go ahead, we will be looking for volunteers!

As a u3a, we are not permitted to remunerate our own members so the meeting would be less costly than our monthly membership meetings where outside speakers are remunerated. We believe that this venture might encourage additional interaction and friendships between our members.

A trip to The Secret Bunker in Nantwich will be followed by a visit to Dorfold Hall with the magnificent gardens. Further details will follow.

Setting up In Case of Emergency (ICE) Information on your mobile phone

Knutsford and District u3a recommends the use of this facility for all members who have a mobile phone

It is very easy to set up an emergency contact number on your mobile phone which can be accessed by emergency services or anyone helping you if you have an accident or a medical emergency. It can be accessed even if your phone is locked without prejudicing the security of any other information held on your phone. More than one number can be stored so you could put your spouse/partner's number and also a number for another next of kin. This would also be useful in case of a medical emergency while you are on a u3a activity. You can also store key medical information here, e.g. whether you are diabetic, which would also help emergency services or anyone else trying to help you.

The simplest way, working for all mobile phones, is to enter "ICE" as a Contact and to provide the appropriate emergency contact telephone number and any other details that can be included against that Contact. However, this is only of use if the mobile phone is not locked. For phones that are normally locked when not in use, a different approach is recommended, and this will depend on the type of phone:

iPhones

- 1. Open the **Health** app and tap the **Medical ID** tab.
- 2. Tap **Edit**. If asked, tap **Set up Medical ID**. If you already have this set up tap **Edit Medical ID**, to make any changes you wish to.
- 3. To make your Medical ID available from the Lock screen on your iPhone, turn on **Show When Locked**. In an emergency, this gives information to people who want to help.
- 4. Enter your name, who to contact and health information like your birth date, medical conditions, medications, allergies, and blood type. Some of this information can be entered later if you don't have it to hand.
- 5. Tap Done.

The same procedure applies if you wish to change any of the data.

In an emergency, responders can access this information when the phone is locked as follows:

- 1. Go to the lock screen
- 2. Tap Emergency. This will bring up the keypad and allow an emergency phone call if required
- 3. Tap **Medical ID**. This will reveal the medical and contact information that you have saved

Android Phones

- 1. Switch on and go to the lock screen bringing up the emergency keypad. This may require double tapping the **Functional Settings** key (a cog image)
- 2. Tap Emergency Call
- 3. Double tap Emergency Information
- 4. Tap the **Edit** icon (pencil) on top right
- 5. Enter your phone Password/PIN
- 6. Add or edit your Emergency Information
- 7. Tap Contacts
- 8. Select an emergency contact from your Contacts List
- 9. Tap Add Contact
- 10. Return to lock screen using back-arrows

The same procedure applies should you wish to change any of the information.

In an emergency, responders can access your Emergency Information by following steps 1-3 above.

PEOVER HALL AND GARDENS

Additional Visit

Monday 23rd May 2022

Cost, £13 each, including tour, afternoon tea and cake. <u>Please note that Transport is not included</u>

The first visit to Peover Hall scheduled for May 16th filled up very quickly so we have arranged a **SECOND** guided tour of the Hall, the attractive Gardens and also the Grade 1 Carolean Stables on **Monday 23rd May**. This will be followed by tea and cake in their Stables tearoom.

Please note, the tour involves climbing three separate staircases (there is no lift available).

I am sure you are all aware of Peover Hall, but you may not know its fascinating history, dating back to 1585 in Elizabethan times, through extensions in Georgian times, and its use in the war for the U.S Army. Following that the Brooks family acquired it, and for the last twenty years have undertaken major restorations, and lived at the hall ever since.

As the hall is only a short drive away (5.5 miles), we have not arranged a coach, and hope that you will be happy to make your own way there. However, if you do not have access to transport and cannot arrange a lift, then <u>please indicate this on the attached booking form</u>. We will then endeavour to find a lift for you, from the bus station. This may have to be a shared taxi, for which you will have to meet your share of the cost.

We have been asked to arrive at the hall between 2.00 and 2.15 pm, the tours will start at 2.30 pm. The post code of the Hall, for use in SatNav is **WA16 9HW**

Two special gardens near Market Drayton

WOLLERTON OLD HALL and HODNET HALL

Monday 4th July

Cost £42 includes morning coffee, entrance to two gardens, sandwich lunch and travel. Coach departs 9.15 am.

A visit has been arranged to these two lovely gardens. After coffee on arrival, we will spend the morning at Wollerton, a modern, formal 4 acre garden set around a 16th century hall (not open). The garden has won many prestigious awards. The garden rooms are richly planted with perennials and bursting with design ideas. I have been several times and am more than happy to go again - it is a treat!

We will then take a very short drive to Hodnet Hall, where we will have lunch in their half-timbered garden restaurant. The gardens provide a good contrast to Wollerton, being more spacious with 60 acres of grounds and parklands, lakeside walks, formal gardens with colourful displays and an interesting kitchen garden. The Heber-Percy family have maintained the gardens for over 300 years and, again, have won many awards.

Holiday in Alnwick, Northumberland


4 Nights / 5 Days Sunday 12th – Thursday 16th June 2022

We will be staying at the White Swan Hotel in the centre of Alnwick. This is a comfortable 300 year old coaching inn whose features include decor in the restaurant which was salvaged from the Titanic's sister ship, RMS Olympic. The White Swan is now part of Classic Lodges, a small group of 15 luxury hotels throughout the country. Alnwick Castle and Gardens are within easy walking distance of the hotel and Alnwick itself, being centrally placed near the Northumbrian coast, gives us easy access for our coach trips. Perfect!
