Members' Meetings Knutsford Methodist Church Second Thursday of every month starting at 2.15pm 8th September Groups Showcase event and social to start at the earlier time of 2pm. This will be a similar format to last year providing the opportunity for groups to promote their activities to members and non-members. Tables will be allocated to each group to display visual or other information. The event will be supported by banners and other publicity material outside the entrance to the church to attract members of the public. We also hope to promote the event in local media. Tea and biscuits will be available. If you know of any friends or relatives who might be interested please invite them along. Last year's event was successful in attracting new members to various groups and we hope this will be repeated this year. 13th October Claire Hart will give a talk entitled 'Inherited Metabolic Disorders in the UK history, diagnosis, newborn screening and treatment'. Claire gave us a talk on Zoom during lockdown which was very interesting so we've asked her back to speak to us in person. The talk will cover the following: inherited metabolic disorders are genetically inherited conditions that impair the ability to make or break down a variety of chemical compounds within our cells, with clinical consequences. There are hundreds of different disorders;, some so rare they only affect a few people in the whole world while some are common enough to warrant screening all newborn babies for them. This talk is about the history of the discovery of these disorders, why and how we can test or screen for them and how some can be treated. 10th November Julia Marwood will give a talk on 'Adolphe Valette: the Manchester **Impressionist'** who was an inspiration to L S Lowry. The talk will explore the life and work of an artist whose fine work and inspirational teaching are finally receiving the recognition they deserve. 8th December Norman Harris – topic to be decided. 12th January **Andy Keaven** from Cheshire Police. Further details nearer the time.

The Northern Chamber Orchestra, the oldest professional chamber orchestra in the North West, established in 1967, has gained a formidable reputation for its exciting and engaging concerts. For many years they have had regular, monthly concerts in Macclesfield and elsewhere. They are now moving to the brand-new, purpose-built auditorium of The King's School at Macclesfield and this is their opening concert there.

An exciting programme with Beethoven's Violin Concerto, followed by his Eroica Symphony, in what I hope will be an excellent venue. The concert will be conducted by Delyana Lazarova, Assistant Conductor to Sir Mark Elder at the Hallé. She is joined by the violinist, Jennifer Pike. Born locally, Jennifer was the youngest ever winner of the BBC Young Musician of the Year in 2002 and a major prize-winner in the Menuhin International Violin competition. She is now in demand as a soloist all over the world.

HOGHTON TOWER, PRESTON

Wednesday 24th August

Cost £40 includes travel, morning coffee, entrance to the Tower and gardens, buffet lunch with tea or coffee. Coach departs 9.00 am.

Today's Tower might have been built in 1565 by Thomas Hoghton but it was far from the first; previous structures here date all the way back to 1109.

The hilltop location from the heart of Lancashire which made Hoghton Tower strategically crucial for centuries, now guarantees, on a clear day, brilliant views to the Lakes, the Irish Sea and Wales. Kings, queens, artists and authors have all been regular visitors adding their stories and a national perspective to what has always been a unique and inspiring setting. If the Tower had kept a guest book you would find the signatures of, among others, William III and Queen Mary, Dickens and Shakespeare.

Hoghton Tower, a Grade I listed building, is the ancestral home of the de Hoghtons. Its history, when told by the tour guides, is an entertaining, revealing and human story of why Shakespeare was here, how King James I 'knighted' a loin of beef, and exactly which 'Peaky Blinders' scenes were played out at the Tower.

u3a Holiday in Northumbria





On Sunday, 12th June, bright and early, 30 u3a members set off at 9am sharp on a coach trip to Northumbria for 5 days. Margaret Hinde and Lynda Harris had organised the trip through Simply Groups travel agent. We had a driver, Ron, who also acted as courier and drove us to all the places visited in this interesting and beautiful county of Northumbria.

After a brief stop at Tebay service station we went on to visit the Bowes museum for a conducted tour around the French style chateau / museum with its wonderful collections of furniture, ceramics, art and many other works which had been collected by a fascinating couple, John and Josephine Bowes in the 19th century, well worth the visit. We then continued to our base, the White Swan Hotel, Alnwick, famous for its original oak panelling, stained glass windows,



and revolving entrance salvaged from the RMS Olympic, sister ship to the ill-fated Titanic.

The morning of Day 2 was devoted to exploring Alnwick and its main attractions of formal gardens, castle and renowned, amazing Barterbooks bookshop housed in the former railway station. Some chose to visit the castle and gardens and others fitted in an exploration of Alnwick and the bookshop. The afternoon was devoted to another garden, Howick Hall and Arboretum, which we all agreed provided a pleasant contrast to the Alnwick garden's formality, with its less structured planting schemes and 'wilding', fitting in with current approaches to gardening.



Day 3 was a fine day and just right for a visit to Lindisfarne, Holy Island, so we could see the scenic coastal views and the castle in the best possible weather conditions. Some chose to visit the castle, others to walk and take in the views and enjoy the fresh air and atmosphere. Those interested, visited the small, enchanting, walled garden in the shadow of the castle designed and built by Gertrude Jekyll in 1911. In the afternoon of day 3 we went on to Bamborough where there was a choice of a conducted tour of the castle or a Farne Island Cruise. Thankfully the weather was kind and the sea calm and the cruise took us from Seahouses out to the islands where we saw (and smelt!) thousands of seabirds some nesting and many flying and swimming on the hunt for their next meal.



In beautiful weather on Day 4 we made a morning visit to the picturesque, peaceful harbour town of Amble. Many chose to walk out along the estuary where fish was available fresh off the boat and interesting 'pods', small stalls, were selling a variety of goods and refreshments. The sea views along the coastline were spectacular in the blue sky and sunshine.

The afternoon visit was to Cragside House, Gardens and Estate, the creation of Lord Armstrong, a Victorian inventor and industrialist. On our tour of the house we saw many interesting features including lights and lamps originally lit by hydroelectricity, a passenger lift, fire alarm panels, telephones and a Turkish bath suite and many home comforts built before their time. The gardens were challenging to explore because of the steep paths to be negotiated but very picturesque nevertheless.



We had an early start on our last day to fit in more exciting visits on the journey home. We stopped at the Angel of the North, the iconic feature of public art in Gateshead.

The afternoon featured a visit to Newby Hall and Gardens, near Ripon, where our guide's most entertaining stories brought the history of the house and its occupants to life. If you were quick you could also fit in a tour of the award gardens, a river tour, a miniature train ride and visit the teddy bear museum, home of a selection of Giles Brandreth's collection of bears!

Then it was homeward bound with our trusty driver, Ron, who delivered us back to Knutsford bus station after a week of most enjoyable whistle stop adventures.
