Brian will tell us how they were adapted to match changing tastes; from the elegance of the French chateau and the heaviness of the Dutch renaissance to the dazzling sophistication of what became known as "streamline moderne" and will show rare archive photographs of interiors from iconic ships such as the original Mauretania to the magnificent, but short lived

Normandie.

Classical Greek

The Group has held seven meetings during which we have dipped into the language but mainly been reading and studying Homer's Iliad – arguably the first great work of western literature; it was originally transmitted orally until finally being written down in the mid-sixth century BCE. We have read this 15,000 line poem in Richmond Lattimore's translation and we have discussed the text, its historical and cultural contexts and the archaeological evidence for the war of which Homer describes a brief episode in its tenth year.

In our upcoming meeting on 8th November we will conclude our review of the influence that The Iliad has exerted during its 2,500 year history on the decorative arts, literature, cinema and much else besides.

We will then turn our attention to Oedipus – who murdered his father and married his mother – in Sophocles's plays set in the city of Thebes. Complex you think? So did Freud.

This Group is not just for those with an enquiring mind who wish to be intellectually stretched. But it helps.

Obituary - Tim Donelly

(10 December 1937 - 7 October 2022)

Tim was a familiar figure at u3a meetings until recent times, when ill health prevented him from joining in many activities he had previously enjoyed.

He joined u3a at the inaugural meeting in 2005 and made a significant contribution. He has been a member of the Committee and Honorary Treasurer. He was a member of the Outings Committee and ran a memorable holiday to the Hebrides, as well as a number of day trips.

Tim was an active participant in Walking Group 1, Wine Group 1, Architecture, Art Group 1. He surprised members of the latter group when he appeared as Grayson Perry when we were studying 20th Century British Art. Recently, he started the Climate Change Discussion Group.

Tim enjoyed participating in the joint venture with Knutsford Academy "Old School" involving Seniors spending time talking to students on a one-to-one basis. He was always interested and interesting to young students.

Tim was born in Wilmslow and spent his early years in Oxfordshire, returning to Manchester to work for Jute Industries after National Service. Eventually he settled in Knutsford and spent the last 22 years living in Garden Road with his beloved partner Margaret Cole. They shared many interests, including the theatre and gardening on their allotment. He was a loving father and grandfather and an enthusiastic supporter of Manchester City.

The large number of people attending his funeral on 28 October reflected his diversity of interests and the high regard in which he was held by so many people in Knutsford and beyond.
