From the Chair

Spring is just around the corner after what seems like a very long Winter. As you can see below, the Outings and Theatre groups have produced an excellent programme of trips for the Spring and Summer. There are now only a very few tickets still available for our visit to the popular musical Hamilton which is coming to the Palace Theatre, Manchester in November. I particularly enjoyed the recent trip to the JCB factory at Rocester, near Uttoxeter (see photo below). A great day out and good to see a manufacturing process using skilled labour and robotics up close.

We now have a full complement of activity groups and continue to welcome ideas for new groups. Since the beginning of the year a yoga group and a personal fitness group have started and are now meeting regularly. We also now have five walking groups, two of which arrange walks of about 5km (3 miles) on Thursdays and Fridays. If you see a group on our website that interests you do contact the group leader to find out more.

This month we will be renewing memberships. The rate is £18 for the membership year April 2023 to end of March 2024, the same as last year, despite the increase in inflation. I hope that you find being a member of Knutsford u3a a rewarding experience and that you will wish to renew your membership. As you know from a recent email sent out, we are planning to claim Gift Aid this year. If you are eligible to tick the box (either online or on the paper form) for Gift Aid please seriously consider doing so as it will allow us to reclaim the tax you paid on your membership fee; this is worth about £4.50 for each full member. We can use this money to keep our membership fees as low as possible in future years.

Within the membership section of our website you will find the options for renewing your membership. Please renew online via Beacon using the appropriate link if at all possible, as it means less work for the Committee who are all volunteers. Alternatively, you can print off a membership form and follow the instructions.

Membership Renewal due 1st April 2023

Many thanks to those of you who have already renewed. It is quick and easy to renew on-line. You need to go to our website knutsfordu3a.co.uk and go to the 'Membership' section. From there go to the 'Renew Your Membership' section at the bottom of the page and click on 'Beacon Membership Renewal' to go to the 'Renew On-line' page.

Here you will find the Terms and Conditions of Membership followed by a final link to the Beacon renewal. You will need to enter your details exactly as they were given on the email I sent out at the end of March. If you have lost this don't worry, a reminder email containing the same information will be sent out later in April to those of you who have not yet renewed

If you need more help, a link to a 'Guide to Renewing on-line' can be found towards the bottom of the 'Renew On-line' page.

Gift Aid

Starting with the 2023/4 membership year we would like to claim **Gift Aid** on members' subscriptions.

- We can claim Gift Aid if you have paid the same amount or more in Income Tax and/or Capital Gains Tax in the tax year and you
- make a Gift Aid declaration that gives us permission to claim it.

The Gift Aid will be 25p for every £1 of your subscription so the tax we can claim on £18 will be £4.50p. This will help us to keep subscriptions as low as possible. You can Gift Aid your subscription by ticking the Gift Aid box when you renew on-line or, if you renew by cheque, ticking the Gift Aid box on the paper form. We would be grateful if those of you who are taxpayers would consider ticking the Gift Aid box.

Please note that if each member at the same address is a taxpayer and wishes to Gift Aid their subscriptions you should NOT use the on-line facility to pay both subscriptions together.

You can still renew online but each taxpayer should pay their own subscription and tick the Gift Aid box to allow us to claim Gift Aid.

If you are unsure whether you will pay enough tax, please do NOT tick the Gift Aid box.

If you pay less Income Tax and/or Capital Gains Tax in a tax year than the amount of Gift Aid claimed on all your donations it is your responsibility to pay any difference.

Once you have renewed, please let us know if you:

- want to cancel your Gift Aid declaration.
- change your name or home address.
- no longer pay sufficient tax on your income and/or capital gains.

For those of you who cannot renew on-line there is a printable Membership Renewal form at the end of this edition of Kanuta or you can download the form from our website.

VISIT to LIVERPOOL

Tuesday 16th May 2023 Cost, including Liver Building tour £30.00
Cost, coach only £15.00
Coach departs the bus station 9 am

We start our visit with an optional tour of one of the Three Graces, the iconic Liver Building on the Waterfront. In the Visitors Centre we will see unique images and pieces from the building's construction, we will meet our guide and watch a brief safety video.

A lift will take us to the 10th floor to see the views of the Mersey towards the Welsh mountains. After that 89 stairs (purely voluntary!) will take us to the 14th floor for a 9 minute, 270° Audio Visual experience unlike any other in Liverpool. A further 35 stairs get you to the 15th floor, the top of the Royal Liver Building, where you can admire the Liver Bird sculptures and enjoy the 360° degree views of the city.

On your return to the ground floor you are then free to enjoy what Liverpool has to offer at your own pace. I will provide you with an information sheet to help you make your choices which will include details of the hop on, hop off bus.

If you do not wish to climb all or any of the stairs you can return to the ground floor and begin your exploration of the city earlier.

We will meet at 4pm for the journey home.

Food and drink are not included but you will find numerous places to satisfy most needs.

CROMFORD MILL AND ASHFORD-IN-THE-WATER

Thursday 15th June 2023

Cost, including refreshments £39.00
Coach departs the bus station 09:15 am

The day begins with a one and a half hour drive through lovely countryside, across the moor to Buxton and on to Cromford, situated deep in the Derwent Valley. The Mill at Cromford is part of the 15 mile long UNESCO Derwent Valley Heritage Site and, as part of our guided tour, we shall learn more about Sir Richard Arkwright and discover how the textile industry developed in this rural valley over 250 years ago. The tour will last about one and a half hours.

Refreshments will be available on arrival and a light lunch of soup and scones will be served at about 1pm. During the lunch break you may wish to look around some of the small, independent businesses in the Mill Yard; these include shops selling cheese, gifts and souvenirs, local woolly goods, antiques etc. There are also lovely riverside walks just outside the walls.

At 2pm we shall leave Cromford and drive north along the Derwent Valley, through Matlock and Bakewell to Ashford-in-the-Water. This is one of the prettiest villages in the Peak District and home to the most photographed bridge in Britain! We have timed our visit to coincide with the Well Dressing celebrations. These are thought to have originated as part of a pagan festival to give thanks for a reliable water source. There will be free time to wander around the village and visit the six wells or take afternoon tea in one of the cafes.

We shall leave Ashford-in-the-Water at 4pm to arrive back in Knutsford just after 5 o'clock.
